Operating safety

▲ WARNING

If you operate information systems and communication equipment integrated in the vehicle while driving, you will be distracted from traffic conditions. You could also lose control of the vehicle. There is a risk of an accident. Only operate the equipment when the traffic situation permits. If you are not sure that this

is possible, park the vehicle paying attention to traffic conditions and operate the equipment when the vehicle is stationary.

MARNING

If you operate mobile communication equipment while driving, you will be distracted from traffic conditions. You could also lose control of the vehicle. There is a risk of an accident. Only operate this equipment when the vehicle is stationary.

You must observe the legal requirements for the country in which you are currently driving when operating mobile communications equipment in the vehicle.

If it is permitted by law to operate communications equipment while the vehicle is in motion, you may only do so if the traffic situation permits. You may otherwise be distracted from the traffic conditions, cause an accident and injure yourself and others.

Do not use the Voice Control System in an emergency as the sound of your voice can change in stressful situations. This could cause a delay in completing your phone call in a timely manner.

Familiarize yourself with the functions of the Voice Control System voice control system before beginning your journey. Only operate the voice control system when traffic conditions permit.

Useful information

This Supplement describes all models, and standard and optional equipment for your system, as available at the time of going to print. Country-specific differences are possible. Bear in mind that your vehicle may not feature all functions described here. This also applies to safety-relevant systems and functions.

Using the multifunction steering wheel

The Voice Control System is operational approximately thirty seconds after the ignition is switched on.

Voice prompting

- To start a dialog: press the J₁ button on the multifunction steering wheel. After a tone has sounded, you may say a command.
- To correct an entry:say the correction command. You will be prompted to say a new command.
- ► To select an entry from the selection list: say line number or what it contains.
- To browse the selection list: say the continue or back command.

You can pause the Voice Control System any time using the **pause** command or cancel the Voice Control System using the $\boxed{\operatorname{org}}{}_{\mathcal{K}}$ or $\boxed{}_{\mathcal{K}}$ button on the multifunction steering wheel. To continue or restart the dialog, press the $\boxed{}_{\mathcal{M}}$ button on the multifunction steering wheel.

Operation 5

Operable functions

Vehicles with COMAND: the Voice Control

System allows you to operate the following systems, depending on the equipment in your vehicle:

- Telephone
- Navigation
- Address book
- Audio (radio, CD/DVD changer, CD/DVD player, memory card, hard disk, Media Interface, USB, Bluetooth[®] audio)
- Video

Say the commands without pausing between individual words. If you enter a non-existent command, the Voice Control System responds with:

• Please repeat.

or

Please repeat your entry

The Voice Control System confirms when you enter important commands and informs you when you make an ambiguous entry.

You can terminate a voice dialog at any time by saying the command **Cancel** or by pressing the $\boxed{\circ \mathbf{f} \mathbf{f}}$ button on the steering wheel.

Command types

A distinction is made between the following types of command in the Voice Control System:

- Global commands can be called up at any time, e.g. the Help telephone or Help nav-igation command.
- Local commands are only valid for the active application, e.g. Next station, when radio is on or Next track, when CD/DVD is active
- Commands, which can be used in a dialog, e.g. Yes or OK

You can operate more than one application at the same time. When the navigation and radio applications are active, for example, you can use both applications simultaneously.

Entering numbers and spelling out

Entering numbers:

- Digits from zero to nine are permissible.
- Say phone numbers as blocks of digits with three to five digits per block.

Spelling out:

- The letters of the alphabet and the digits **one** to **nine** are permissible.
- Say the letters in a block of five to seven letters.
- Say each letter clearly.

Changing the language setting

You can change the Voice Control System language by changing the system language. If the set system language is not supported by the Voice Control System, English will be selected. The Voice Control System is available in English, French and Spanish.

- Select Vehicle in the main function bar. The vehicle menu is displayed.
- ► To select System Settings: slide ⊙↓, turn and press the controller. A menu appears.
- To select Language: turn and press the controller.
- To select the desired language: turn and press the controller.
 The system language is set.

Help functions

Audible help functions

- For information on ideal operation: say the Help voice control system command.
- For the current application: press the Ju button on the multifunction steering wheel and say the Help command.
- For continued dialog: say the Help command during a voice dialog.
- For a specific system: say the help command for the desired system, e.g. Help telephone.

Help window

You can use the help window to display a selection of valid commands on the COMAND display. The commands are hidden as soon as you start to speak.

- Opening/closing the help window: select Vehicle in the main function bar. The vehicle menu is displayed.
- ► To select System Settings: slide ⊙↓, turn and press the controller. A menu appears.
- ► To select Voice Control: turn and press the controller.
- Select Help Window. You have switched the help window on ✓ or off □.

Improving voice recognition

The Voice Control System does not understand you:

- Only operate the Voice Control System from the driver's seat.
- State the commands coherently and clearly without exaggerating.
- Prevent loud noises, e.g. the fan, from interfering while you make an entry.
- Say the voice tag with the same intonation both times when creating voice tags.

An address book entry voice tag is not recognized:

- Ensure that the address book entries make sense, e.g. that first name and surname are listed in the correct field.
- Do not use any abbreviations, unnecessary spaces and special characters.
- Create a speaker-dependent voice tag, if necessary.
- Say the read out contacts command.
- Press the J₁ button on the multifunction steering wheel when the name you want is read out.

A station list entry is not recognized:

- Save a speaker-dependent voice tag for the station.
- Say the read out station list command.
- Press the J₁₀ button on the multifunction steering wheel when the station you want is read out.

Individualization

General notes

Using individualization, you can fine-tune the Voice Control System to your own voice and thus improve voice recognition.

It is only possible to start individualization with the vehicle stationary. After starting the session, you will individualize the system using voice instructions.

Individualization comprises two parts. You individualize the system for digits in the first part and for specific commands in the second part.

The system can be reset to the factory settings at any time.

Individualization does not need to be completed in full. Even individualizing the digits will result in a significant improvement in the recognition rate. Individualization can be stopped after the first part.

Effectively using the Voice Control System

If individualization is activated, it may affect the voice-recognition quality of other users. Switch off individualization if it impairs the voice-recognition quality of other users.

Starting new individualization

- Select Vehicle in the main function bar. The vehicle menu is displayed.
- ► To select System Settings: slide ⊙↓, turn and press the controller. A menu appears.
- ► To select Voice Control: turn and press the controller.
- Select Start New Individualization. You will see and hear a prompt, asking whether you would like further information.
- ► Select Yes or No.
 - If you select No, the first part of individualization begins.
 - If you select Yes, you will see and hear more information.

At the end of the first part, a prompt will appear asking whether you wish to begin the second part.

- ► Select Yes or No.
 - If you select No, individualization will be canceled. The data is stored automatically.
 - If you select Yes, the second part will begin. Individualization is completed at the end of the second part.
- You may cancel individualization using Cancel or delete using Delete Individualization and switch on or off using Individualization On.

Navigation commands

General notes

The navigation system cannot take the prevailing traffic situation into account or recognize any dangers or obstacles. You must therefore be constantly aware of the prevailing road and traffic conditions so that you can recognize any dangers and react to them.

Navigation announcements are intended to direct you while driving without diverting your attention from the road and driving. Please always use this feature instead of consulting the map display for directions. The symbols or the map display could distract you from traffic conditions and driving. Route guidance only provides recommendations. You must always comply with the applicable road traffic regulations and adapt your driving style to the prevailing conditions.
